

She arranged live Zoom meets with each author: Marsha Forchuk Skrypuch, Rachel (RL) Toalson, Kirby Larson, and Lisa Moore Ramee. Her students were able to listen to each author read from their books and then ask many questions to each author in an experience they will remember. This provided opportunities to study many topics including pioneer times, WWII, Japanese internment camps, Ukraine, and other diverse issues, discussing historical significance, life changing events, themes, and learning more about ourselves as a result.
